



#### To their health!

Muttville is one of the only rescue organizations in the country with a veterinary program. So many senior dogs arrive in dire need of medical care that as soon as we moved into our current HQ, we devoted an area to first aid and running basic tests. It was staffed by a single vet tech.

We realized that in-house medicine could not only help our dogs in an emergency, but could significantly lower costs. Chief Veterinary Officer Angela Ramiro joined the team in 2015 and began, step by step, to build a robust program.

We now have a full-time veterinarian, two full-time and one part-time vet techs, an area for dental procedures and a sterile surgical suite, and a huge network of veterinary professionals and clinics that volunteer or work at discount.

#### Intake

Every dog gets an intake exam, blood panel, flea and tick medicine, vaccinations, and treatment for chronic conditions. Every dog in pain gets immediate relief. If warranted, dogs are scheduled for further procedures, including dental work.





# **Dentals**

Dental care is so critical to a dog's general health that our first room in the new vet suite was for dental treatment and surgery. We do an average of 16 dentals a week.

## Surgery

We perform spays and neuters, enucleations, mass removal and other soft tissue surgeries in-house. Specialty surgeons donate their time for complicated or unusual procedures.






#### **Emergency**


